Making a Build-A-Bear-Workshop (c) Bear for a Magnet Board

Begin by cutting the following pieces using the Stampin' Up! Bear Sizzix Bigz Die: Bear from Creamy Caramel Textured Card Stock; Muzzle from Very Vanilla Card Stock; heart from Real Red Card Stock. Punch a 1-1/4" circle from Chocolate Chip Card stock.



Using 2-Way Glue Pen, attach the muzzle and the heart to front of bear.



Turn bear over and use Glue Pen to attach the Circle to back of bear's head.



Your Bear is now ready to become a magnet!!



Before I applied magnets, I laminated my bear and trimmed the plastic around the edges.

The bear needs two magnets: 1 that faces towards the front of the bear and to which the magnetized clothes will attach, and 1 to face away from the back of the bear to attach the bear to the magnet board.



For the both magnets, I use a business card magnet (they're very thin). Attach a lightweight piece of paper to the sticky side of the magnet. In this case, I used some of the food wrapper paper from the Country Living Barbeque kit. Cut the magnet with the Stampin' Up! Bear die, covering the trunk and legs of the bear.

Attach the magnet side of the cut piece to the back of the bear using sticky strip.

For the rear facing magnet, punch a 1-1/4" circle from a magnet and apply it to the back of the bear's head, covering the Chocolate Chip circle.



Now you're ready to put magnets on the bear's clothes. I began by cutting clothes from Pawsitively Prints Designer Series Paper which I had laminated before cutting.

Cut a piece of magnet and, without removing the covering of the sticky side, place it on the bear until the piece settles into position. You may need to use more than one piece of magnet, but don't use too much or you will weigh down the clothes. Leaving the magnet(s) in place, remove the covering of the sticky side and lay the clothing article on top of the now sticky magnet and press firmly to adhere.

Repeat with however many articles of clothing you wish!



Here is my bear on a blank Magnetic White Board. Think it needs some decorations—and another bear for company!
