

## Stamp Assembly Using the Stamp-a-ma-jig

One of the advantages to Stampin' Up!'s unassembled stamps is that you can position the rubber images however you like. Some crafters want to center the stamp image on the wood block (that's me), while others prefer to place the rubber near an edge or corner of the block (that's me, too, with alphabet stamps). There's no right or wrong way - but here's a suggestion to help you get the perfect placement.

When you assemble your stamps using the Stamp-a-ma-jig, the label will be placed precisely to match the rubber. This way, you know exactly where you're stamping each time. Here's how.

---

Step 1. Mount the rubber stamp on the wood block.



Step 2. Line up the corner of the Stamp-a-ma-jig imaging sheet with your Stamp-a-ma-jig, and stamp the image in the corner of the sheet.



Step 3. Turn the imaging sheet over, and line up the label, stick-side-up, over the stamped image. Lightly adhere the label to the imaging sheet using Dotto adhesive (dotto is a temporary adhesive).



Step 4. Line up the stamp with the Stamp-a-ma-jig once again. Turn the imaging sheet back over, line up the corner with the Stamp-a-ma-jig over the stamp, and press down on the block to adhere the label.
